MAG Show Application Process

MAG is introducing an application process for all of it's art shows. It began with the Salon and is now being extended to the January Showcase. While it requires a little more time from members and will take some getting used to, it will correct some current problems and better organize our shows. By now you have received the one page application for the January Showcase. It shows the application deadline and dates and times for art drop-off and pick-up. Since participation in the Salon is no longer a MAG requirement, the application process provides a record of each member's participation in MAG activities. Having the applications will allow the preparation of show labels in advance of drop-off, greatly improving the process for hanging our show. MAG's attempts to secure liability weavers in the past have been legally questionable. The new forms provide a liability weaver for each artist, for each show. In the future, MAG as an organization will be protected in the unlikely event someone's art is damaged or stolen.

While it might seem logical to simply submit the application form electronically, that is not acceptable. Sorry. The reason being that an original signature is required for the liability weaver to be valid. What will happen if you just show up at drop-off with your work? That depends on the people working



at intake. They are not obligated to accept art that has not been identified in an application, and no identification labels will be available for your art. If it is accepted and someone is willing to produce extra labels for you, you will still have to complete and sign an application at drop-off. Such action is discouraged and will not be accepted beyond exceptions during this introductory period. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation.

January Showcase

The January Showcase will be held again next year in the Skylight Lounge of U.W. Hospital and Clinics. Artists may provide one or two art works, which may be two or three dimensional. The application deadline for the show is January 3, 2015. Drop-off will be at the main entrance to U. W. Hospital on Saturday, January 10 between 9:00 a.m. and 10:30 a.m. Art will be picked up after the show at the same entrance between 9:00 a.m. and 10:30 a.m. on Saturday, February 7, 2015. All artwork may be offered for sale but preferably will remain on display for the duration of the show. Two dimensional art must have a hanging wire attached to the frame. All art should be identified with a tag on the back or bottom of the piece. With your participation, we can all look forward to another great show.

What Are You Up To?

Elizabeth Winters and **Kailey Barthel** are pleased to announce their upcoming exhibition *Interior Motives: An Exploration of Domestic Interiors, Memory, and Space* in the Playhouse Gallery at the Overture Center for the Arts. The exhibit runs December 10, 2014 to February 1, 2015. There will be a reception held on January 16, 2015, 4:30 until 6:30.

The two artists examine the role of space and imagery in the human experience. Their work seeks to challenge the viewer's own awareness of the rooms in which they interact, and invites the observer to consider how space and environment continuously affect our memories and connections.

Kailey Barthel's body of work has frequently drawn upon memories of domestic spaces and their relationship to absence and loss. Reflecting on the unreliability and flux of personal memory, Kailey tries to suggest the instability that takes place in the mind when recalling a space or situation. Although the spaces are seemingly ordinary in many respects, each image is endowed with an ambiguous, overhanging uncertainty. These interiors resonate in the viewer like stages, suggesting a space in which something has happened or is waiting to happen, adding to the unsettling atmosphere of the scene.

Elizabeth Winters' pen and ink drawings examine the interplay between people and furniture within homes and familiar spaces. She believes that furnishings are an integral part of the human experience and that our intimacy with these objects humanizes them in some ways. She is especially interested in the way furniture becomes animated, creating a conversation of its own with people as the supporting cast.

David Carpenter is showing two of his colored pencil drawings at the *Coffee Gallerie* from Nov. 22 through Dec. 31. The *Coffee Gallerie* is located at 1865 Northport Drive, in the mall at the intersection of N. Sherman Ave. and Northport Dr. The show also features the work of other members of the Northside Artist's Group.

Chuck Tupa moved his art gallery and frame shop in early October. *Tupa Gallery and Framing* is now at 2034 Main Street, Cross Plains. Chuck is planning an open house on December 6th, from 10 am until 3pm. Free hot cider and cookies. All MAG artists are cordially invited. Some exhibit spaces are still available.
