To keep the spirit of artistic effort alive, however, we have decided to award certificates of merit in each media category. Winners will be selected via member voting. Additional information and instruction will be forthcoming.

# **MAG Bi-Monthly Meetings Minutes**

May 12, 2020, 6:30 pm

#### TREASURER'S REPORT - Tom

Tom reported that our checking account balance is \$6545.42 and our CD balance is \$5038.47, with total funds amounting to \$11,583.84. This balance is lower than usual due to recent expenses, such as fees for storage, P.O. box and insurance.

### ART NIGHT AND METALS MEETINGS UPDATE

We reviewed the "new normal" of MAG meetings held via zoom. It was noted that the metals meeting moved at a better pace because Martha (as moderator) kept track of each participant's time. There was discussion about imposing similar time constraints for art night attendees. It was noted that if we do impose limits, we should not eliminate the opportunity for artwork critique. Also, the moderator has the ability to mute participants in order to eliminate background noise. It was suggested that a moderator be assigned for each art night meeting. We discussed and decided that art nights would remain virtual through June, with a 7pm start time to allow participants time for dinner.

#### SALON UPDATE - Colette

Colette proposed that, due to numerous limitations imposed by Covid 19, we cancel plans for a physical exhibit this year. A vote was taken and the proposal passed. The option of a virtual exhibit was discussed and we decided to go forward with that plan. We assessed the pros and cons of formal judging (including monetary awards) versus a member's choice vote. There was concern that photographs of artwork (especially 3-D) might not adequately represent the quality of each piece. A vote was taken and it was decided that each member could cast a vote for their favorite piece in each media category and certificates of merit would be awarded to the winners. Chris's husband, Jeff, agreed to help set up the virtual exhibit. Colette will coordinate with Jeff and will send out an email shortly inviting members to submit their entries.

There was talk about initiating a rotating art show every 3-4 months which could be incorporated into MAG's Facebook page. Chris will talk with Mary Palmer about this.

### FALL JURY OF NEW MEMBERS - Theresa and Martha

Due to Covid 19 restrictions, Theresa and Martha recommended that we not schedule a new member jury this fall. Since the library will not allow the gathering of large groups, MAG representatives would have to be present to enforce social distancing. In addition, new members would not likely have the opportunity to utilize the benefits normally afforded by a membership in MAG. The issue of jurying in new members will be reviewed at our next meeting in July.

## OCTOBER MEETING and GALLERY NIGHT - Karen

Karen is looking into Vintage or Yahara Bay for our Fall meeting (if holding such a gathering will be possible). Yahara Bay is open to hosting a MAG exhibit for Gallery Night in early October. Middleton Art and Framing is another possibility for exhibit. It was suggested that we consider a MAG exhibit of art created while under quarantine.

The next Bi-Monthly Meeting will take place virtually on July 14 at 6:30.
