History of Printmaking Update: Leroy Nieman Pulls a Screen Print

Color Intaglio. 49/100. 1982

Artist- Warrington Colescott (1921-2018)

Estimated Value: \$160 (recently sold at auction for \$600)

This print is also in the Smithsonian American Art Museum. Colescott was a professor at the University of Wisconsin in Madison and part of the printmaking department that was the best in the country. In the 1960's, he began to focus on intaglio printmaking and his imagery evolved into social satire and commentary. This print is one of Colescott's narrative satires on the history of printmaking.

Artist-Karl Schrag

Estimated Value: \$650-3500.

Karl Schrag (1912-200) born in Germany, was an American printmaker and educator. He has been characterized by the National Gallery of Arts as "among the most important printmakers in America in the 1950's."

Artist- Evan Summer Estimated Value: \$100

Evan Summer is an artist specializing in printmaking with work in over 300 exhibitions worldwide and many museum collections, including the Metropolitan Museum of Art, The National Gallery of Art, the Brooklyn Museum of Art and the Philadelphia Museum of Art. He is a printmaking instructor at Kutztown University in Pennsylvania.
