Summer Salon

This year marks the Madison Art Guild's 104th annual Summer Salon. Traditionally celebrated as MAG's premier event, the Salon serves as a platform to recognize and to reward artistic excellence within our membership. Artwork is professionally judged, with twenty-two monetary awards and ribbons presented across a wide variety of media. The 2023 exhibit will run from June 3rd to July 29th at the UW Hospital. It's not too early to begin preparing your best artwork for submission. Guild members are encouraged to participate.

As with our January Showcase, The Salon relies on volunteers to facilitate the process of drop-off, pick-up, and installation of artwork. Assistance is always welcome and appreciated. But, ultimately, the responsibility for overseeing all details from start to finish falls to the event Chair. If an artist fails to pick up their artwork, the Chair is tasked with the job of safely moving unclaimed art from the hospital, attempting to notify the artist and making arrangements for final transfer of the artwork.

While we understand that extenuating circumstances do exist, we ask that all exhibit participants diligently mark pick-up dates in their calendars. The vast majority of participants already do so, or they make arrangements for someone else to retrieve their piece. But every year some artwork remains unclaimed – sometimes for several months. This year we've decided to adopt a standard policy, used by many art organizations, which will be included with your registration form. It states that any artwork still unclaimed 30 days from the pick-up date becomes the property of the Madison Art Guild to store, sell or donate as it deems appropriate.

Salon registration will begin in May. Watch for upcoming email notifications!

After serving as Summer Salon Chair for seven years, Colette Girard plans to resign following the 2023 Salon. She values the extended opportunity to interact with MAG members in this capacity and views it as both an adventure and a learning experience. Salon management involves a good deal of multi-tasking so it was a welcome respite when Marcia Nelson stepped up last year to function as Co-Chair. Summer Salon Co-Chair

We are in need of a Summer Salon Co-Chair for 2024 to oversee the Salon awards process. This position includes management of ribbons, certificates, award checks and the development of media categories. The Co-Chair will also choose a judge for the exhibit, inform her or him of all artwork specifics, establish reimbursement, report on and notify award winners and make sure that the exhibit is photographed for social media. Current Co-Chair, Marcia Nelson, will handle all aspects of Registration (Salon timeline, member notifications, artwork submission forms, artwork labels, hospital forms) as well as oversight for artwork drop-off and pick-up.

We are in need of someone to fill the Membership Chair. Currently the application process is open early August through early September, with juror decisions and notifications in September. This means that the bulk of work is done July-September in about 2-4 hours per week during that time. The rest of the year is simply responding to email inquiries as they come in, plus time spent in the early summer to find and secure a juror.

Salvador Dali at The Art Institute of Chicago

Running from February 18 - June 12, 2023, the Art Institute of Chicago will be hosting a special exhibition of works by surrealist Salvador Dali. This exhibition—the first devoted to the Spanish surrealist at the Art Institute—presents more than 30 paintings, drawings, photos, and surrealist objects, as well as a rich selection of printed matter, books, and artist's ephemera to explore this critical period, considering Dalí's work in light of two defining, if contradictory, impulses: an immense desire for visibility and the urge to disappear.
