The Summer Salon is MAG's premiere event. It is held each year in order to recognize and to reward artistic excellence within our membership. The 2023 Salon Exhibit will run from June 3rd to July 29th at the UW Hospital. Registration runs April 27 through May 19. Information will be coming out soon.

On the Registration Form you will also see a new drop-down box. If you choose not to agree to the terms of the statement, your art work will not be accepted for exhibit at Salon. The statement says:

I agree, when participating in any activity where I submit artwork, to drop off the artwork and pick it up according to the established drop off and pick up dates. After 3 days/72 hours have passed and I have not either (a) retrieved my artwork or (b) contacted the event chair to make other arrangements, I understand that I surrender any claims to ownership and my artwork becomes the property of the Madison Art Guild.

Pyle Center exhibit space available

At the March Board meeting, we discussed the opportunity to have a MAG show at the Pyle Center on the UW Campus. The 2nd floor space is available in November of 2023 and 2024 as well as May, June and July of 2024. Shows run for 1 month. The pros and cons of hosting a show in November were discussed (Pros: good timing for holiday shoppers and doesn't interfere with other shows we have; cabinet space is available on the 2nd floor for 3D items; workshops and conferences are held at the Pyle Center; hallway would accommodate 100+ pieces using the Walker hanging system. Cons: November is busy with members participating in and preparing for other art fairs; 2nd floor lighting isn't as good as first floor). This position is also responsible for organizing an in-person Awards Reception. Current Co-Chair, Marcia Nelson, will handle all aspects of Registration and oversight for artwork drop-off and pick-up. Colette Girard, who has been in this role for 7 years, will support your learning and acclimation to the role.

Currently the application process is open early August through early September, with juror decisions and notifications in September. This means that the bulk of work is done July-September in about 2-4 hours per week during that time. Linda Krantz - Meeting called to order at 6:31pm. Call for approval of January 2023 Board Meeting Minutes. Cindy motions to approve the minutes and Mary Reines seconds the motion.

- Linda Discussion of MAG 501c3 since
 2006. MAG participates in various charitable contributions such as MATC Students, Virtual Show
 Fundraiser, and the HyVee bag sale.
- 2) Some members have stepped down from various positions. Kristin Mahaffey, Mindy Wara, and Alexandra Andros have all stepped down. Karen Faller (website) and Kim Eitland (social media) have joined.
- 3) Treasurers Report Mary Reines

As of March 10 MAG has \$6,547.63 in Unrestricted funds. \$65 in donation. Right now, it's a slow period financially. Have not received the \$178 from HyVee yet which will go to the Salon Awards. The MATC award used to be \$1000, it is now \$500. The 32 Auctions fee for the Virtual Show was paid for last year and this year MAG has to pay for it. Please be thinking of any Future budget needs.

Looking into Pumpkin Hollow, The Goodman Center, and The Fitchburg Community Center as possible Meeting sites. Places where MAG can hold workshops and meetings to benefit Members.



11) Survey - Linda

Linda filled out an Arts and Economic Prosperity Survey as part of research being conducted by the Americans for the Arts group. National results will be published in October.
